Dear Parents, Carers and families,

We are looking forward to welcoming back all children into school on Monday. It is unbelievable to think that it was a year ago the pandemic began. But the community around Upper Arley C of E Primary School has been supportive and compliant, which I believe has helped us to remain well and reasonably unaffected. We are aware of the emotional support that may be needed for our young people and families at this time of readjustment and hope that you would approach us if there is anything we can do to support this.

As a staff we are planning for this return to school similarly to how we did in September with a Recovery Curriculum that is heavily focused on routines, structure and relationships, emotional support and development of basic skills. There will be an initial flexibility to the curriculum content and sessions as the children readjust. Teachers will plan content delivery in small, bite size sessions to enable children to access content without feeling overwhelmed, at their own pace and with a level of challenge to suit their needs. We will keep you updated with how this is going over the next few weeks.

Public Health England have provided a brief update of local situation regarding education.

Throughout the pandemic schools should be the last to close and the first to open.

- · there is strong evidence children are not seriously ill with COVID. The rate across Worcestershire is going down which is a positive.
- · Transmission in schools evidence shows that the number of situations within schools are not spreading through the school environments.
- · There is no great danger to the staff within a school situation 80% of all schools have been affected but these have been bubble closures caused by external cases.
- · Eighty primary schools have confirmed staff cases.
- · Schools complete Risk Assessments and act quickly when there is a case highlighted.
- · Re-opening and the new testing process is currently being given focus.

Vaccination centres all through Worcestershire have now been set up. The Three counties show-ground has opened this week for the vaccinations. Anybody who is over the age of 60 can now be vaccinated through these centre.

- · Social distancing will be absolutely vital for next week—we need to ensure we prevent the infection transmission
- · Keep the bubble format and ensure all follow the **Hands, Face, Space** and system of controls and do not let the procedures slip.

We heed the advice and guidance from the PHE and DfE and ask for your continued to support to protect our school and local community. We are looking forward to being together again and planning school events with safety for when the time is right to gather and share the children's experiences in school.

We will keep you updated on these dates as the remainder of the term unfolds. But spring and the warmer weather are on its way which will make things a little easier to manage, and we have use of our new Marquee, perfect for afternoon tea and outdoor gatherings. Watch this space...

A reminder that Here2Help is here for families self-isolating and unable to get support from friends, family or neighbours.

On the Here2Help website families can find resources to help with staying at home during Coronavirus as well as an online form they can fill out to request the support they need. If the family does not have internet access, they can call **01905 768053** which is open Monday to Thursday, 9am-5pm and Friday 9am-4.30pm.

Here2Help will signpost callers to up to date advice and arrange volunteer support where required to help those who are unable to leave their homes as a result of needing to self-isolate.

- The types of support available include:
- Collecting and delivering food and supplies
- Arranging emergency food support
- Help collecting prescriptions
- Help with other commitments such as pet needs
- Support for those who are feeling isolated
- Advice around money, benefits and debt

PARENT QUESTIONNAIRE FEEDBACK

Thank you to those parents and carers who completed the Parent Questionnaire. Your positive and constructive feedback really does help us to know where further improvements can be made. Can I ask that if there is something that you are not happy or sure about, you discuss this with a member of staff so that support can be given. If we don't know, it is not always easy to solve something or improve it.

A summary of the Parent questionnaire illustrated the following:

- All children feel safe in school
- There are strong connections between school and home
- Parents have been supported in a number of different ways
- School has encouraged children working at home and have had high expectations
- Almost all parents felt school provided suitable emotional support for their child/ren
- Parents felt their children did well at the school but the school could communicate this better.
- Children with SEND were well supported but there is room to further improve this when working from home.

We are constantly striving to improve the school further and appreciate your input and feedback, particularly throughout this difficult and unusual time, where teachers and supporting staff have adjusted their daily practice at short notice and without formal training. I am proud to lead them and provide a nurturing and stimulating environment where children can learn and develop whether at home or at school.
