BIKEABILITY

Well Done to those children who passed their level 1 and 2 Bikeability tests. Safety on the roads particularly around the village is so important. I am pleased to see these children cycling more confidently and being aware of the dangers they may face on the open roads.

WATER BOTTLES

Please ensure that your child has a water bottle in school every day. If they do not, they will be provided with a cup to drink from. It is important that they keep their brains and bodies hydrated.

HEALTHY LUNCHES AND BREAK TIME SNACKS

We have noticed that some children are bringing unhealthy snacks to school in their lunch boxes i.e. Chocolate bars and multiple packets of crisps.

There is aways fresh fruit available at break time for children in Early Years and KS1. We insist that cildren bring a healthy snack to eat at break time. This can be fruit, fruit bars, breakfast bars or anything that does not contain high levels of sugar, salt or fat. Please ensure that these are nut free. Please support our safe and healthy eating ethos in school.

HOMEWORK AND HOMELEARNING To support childrens progress in basic skills in Reading, Writing and Maths learning, class teachers will set small tasks to complete at home on a regular basis. These tasks will be linked explicitly to work your child is doing at school. This work may vary in challenge depending on which year group your child is in. Your child will also be offered **OPTIONAL Homelearning** activities to engage in should they wish to. These will be linked to the topic or theme the class is focusing on. Please talk to your child's class teacher if you have any questions. Thank you for your continued support with this.

Drama Workshop

The children enjoyed consolidating their new found knowledge of Ancient Roman people during their workshop today. They met with *Lucius* yesterday who took the children through dramatic re-enactments of battles and bathing, eating and playing. I hope that the children shared some of their new found facts (some really ghastly ones!) with you.



This term our local **Police Community Support Officer** will be regularly visiting school to talk with children on subjects linked to safety. Cath will be talking with the children in assemblies and also in classrooms. These discussions will be about how to keep safe by water and on the roads as well as how to deal with pressure from their peers and keep safe online when playing games. Your children may come home and talk to you about some of these topics. News from the Governors Autumn No 2 2019

Our monitoring visit last week focused on Engagement, without engagement learning cannot take place. To see how the children are engaged with the whole school day Governors watched how they arrived in school in the morning and their behaviour in the playground before school. The atmosphere upon arrival sets the tone for work before it commences in the classroom. The children quickly and quietly came to their lines for class and were made aware of the expectations for the start of the day; so they began the learning day knowing the expectations of the first moments in the classroom, getting on with the first learning tasks of the day independently and immediately. Governors then attended whole school worship and were introduced to the children so that they knew who the adults visiting school are. Once lessons had commenced Governors noticed the engagement in learning in each class and of children using the library. Every child should be using all time in school in the most effective way for progress in academic subjects and for their social and physical development. Active engaged children are happy and do their best learning.

Finances are very tight in education as I am sure you are aware though the press. We are keeping abreast of spending at Upper Arley CofE Primary School with monthly financial monitoring meetings. This is in line with National Government and Worcestershire Local Authority expectations for a school with a deficit budget. We are not alone in this situation with many schools locally and nationally sharing this financial situation. I am very pleased that we are supported in this scrutiny by Mrs Hope. As well as monthly financial monitoring the Finance and Premises subcommittee of the Full Governing Board will next meet on 17th October to scrutinise spending, question and support the Headteacher in the difficult decisions regarding funding for the school. Minutes of these meetings are attached to the reports to Worcestershire Local Authority who take special notice of schools with deficit budgets.

Governors were delighted to hear about the very successful support the school offered the village with the Macmillan Coffee Morning held next door in the new village hall. The children sang to the parents and visitors from the wider community, and then enjoyed some refreshments before returning to school. Thank you to the support of parents who were able to attend and donate baking. There will be other events at varying times and days so that as many parents as possible can support the school and see their child perform or at work.
