## **Sporting News**

Mr Derrer has been busy organising fixtures and events for the children. See the reports below to see how well our teams have done this term.

#### Kho Kho 26/11- M. Marshall

On Friday, some of the Swifts travelled over to the Stourport sports centre to participate in a 'Kho Kho festival. We were quite unsure of what to expect as we had never heard of it before. The children from Swifts did Upper Arley proud as they listened carefully to instructions and the aim of the game. The children had to weave in and out from the opposition without getting caught. If they succeeded in the time, a point was given. Swifts discussed great tactics and invaded the opposition. Out of three schools, they finished second, which was a wonderful achievement! The Swifts' team demonstrated perseverance, teamwork, passion and honesty. It was a very rewarding experience for all, to compete and engage with other schools once again.

#### 5 a side Football Boys and Girls teams 3/12- T.Derrer

Our late entry into this comp didn't leave a lot of time to train or talk tactics, but that wasn't going to hinder us. Another comp at Stourport Arena, this time attended by the Years 3&4 children. We'd practised using tennis balls and a hockey ball in the P.E. lesson, two days before. This ensured the children weren't going into the event without any experience of the skills needed. Again schools were divided into leagues of 4, and after going behind 3-0 in the first frame, things didn't look good, but the comeback to win 4-3 was a joy to behold.

We went on to win our other 3 games and qualify for the finals, where we finished 4th. A supreme effort by all involved: Charlie C, Elizabeth, Rowan, Henley, Alice, Harrison, Heidi and Olivia.

#### Owls

The Little Owls (Reception) have explored 'Why we celebrate this term?'. They have listened to and discussed Elmer's Birthday, Dipal's Diwali and the Letters to Santa. They have created their own Rangoli patterns and diya using clay. The children planned Elmer's Birthday party by writing invitations, making and decorating their own cakes, party hats and creating party games. They had a brilliant time and shared how they have celebrated birthdays with their families in the past.

Year 1 and Year 2 have thoroughly enjoyed exploring the Polar Express. They have retold the story using text maps and created their own characters' descriptions. The children have designed and made their own pots using clay in the style of Clarice Cliff. We have started to use our woodwork bench to measure and cut different lengths of wood to make the base for our moving vehicles.

#### **Swifts**

Swifts have worked so incredibly hard this term. They have finished off their stone age topic with a 3D model of a stone age settlement. They have written setting descriptions and factual reports. They completed a science experiment, using tools and rocks and they have been creating dances. Here is a picture of Swifts completing a Santa Dash. #### **Falcons**

In Falcons this term, we have been doing a lot of work on The Lion, The Witch and the Wardrobe which the children are really enjoying. They have created some beautiful pieces of

work, such as character descriptions, diary entries and newspaper reports. The children became reporters for the day, interviewing Edmund about his first encounter with Narnia- they did brilliantly! We have even been watching the 1988 BBC version to help us visualise the story even better- the children found the animations hysterical!



The class's maths has really come along- they are now experts at division and multiplication and have worked incredibly hard on learning how to do this.

Last Friday, the children spent all morning researching and creating fact files all about Upper Arley. They were very independent, working in teams, using the laptops, and choosing their own research topics about Upper Arley- they told us some amazing stories and I am now definitely more knowledgeable on Upper Arley and its history from this!

The children have now finished their swimming lessons and they all did fantastically well. They all worked so hard, and we could see them getting better every single week! After half term,

we will be starting dance on a Friday.

The children took part in a Santa dash last Friday which was a lot of fun-Mr Derrer organised it at break time and the children were fabulous!

One of our Falcons, Grace, has been doing some amazing charity work over the Christmas period.

**Forest School:** Owls have now switched their Forest School session from Friday afternoons to Thursday afternoons.


**Dance Exchange:** Falcons will begin their Dance lessons with dance Exchange on Fridays, along with Owls.
