

Little Owls have explored the stories 'Giraffes can't dance' and 'Handa's surprise' they have been intrigued by the African animals and the Savanah. The children created their own Savanah using the sand, water, rocks and animals. Their creativity was fantastic. They have created a car and pulled each other around in this and taken turns. They measured how quickly it went and negotiated the car around the corners.

Year 1 and Year 2 have explored the story 'Wangari's trees of Peace'. The children were amazed that the story was non—fiction and how much she helped changed Kenya. They have created the story in the construction and small world area to help them internalise the story. Year 1 have developed their questioning skills and used question marks within their writing and Year 2 have developed their understanding of commas in a list.




Swifts






Nursery places

Foodie Friday!


March Foodie Friday!




Archery
