Dear Parents and Carers

We have come to the end of a very busy and successful half term. All the children have been enjoying their learning and challenging themselves to do their very best in lessons. The Year 2 and Year 6 children have completed their statutory assessments and tried their very best and after half term the Year I phonic screening will begin during the first week back to school. Following this, the Year 4 children will complete their statutory times table assessments from Monday 6th June through to 24th June.

The children had a wonderful time at the arboretum. The younger children took part in a May Day parade, Swifts did Country Dancing and Falcons shared information about the history of Arley.

The Plant Sale took place on the most beautiful day and the sum of \pounds 620.95 was raised for the children. Thank you so much for your support with donations of plants and cakes to make this event such a huge success. The Kidderminster Foreign Parish Council has given us a grant of \pounds 200 which we have spent on carefully chosen books for our Reading Shed. The books are all about nature and all have outdoor themes to engage the children. We are now sourcing the shed itself and hope to have everything installed very soon. Daisy and Tess had their own stall, raising money for Ukraine with their engaging poems. They raised a magnificent total of \pounds 106, which has now been donated to the Ukraine Humanitarian Appeal.

We had the most magnificent day on Thursday 26th May. All the children from Upper Arley C of E Primary School and St George's C of E School came together for their Platinum Jubilee celebrations. The children were so excited about their train ride with the Severn Valley Railway. Later at school, the children enjoyed Jubilee activities, a picnic on the field and a visit to the ice cream van. Each child has been given a Jubilee gift of a commemorative coin as a special memento. Thank you to The Black Pear Trust for this.

There is some exciting news in relation to staffing for September. After I was appointed as the substantive headteacher at Upper Arley C of E Primary School, an advertisement was placed for a shared Deputy Headteacher across the two schools. We appointed not one but two Deputy Headteachers! I wish you all a restful break and hope that the weather is kind to us all.




