As a link with compassion, Barrie Lewis came in to talk to the children about making up shoeboxes for children abroad. Shoeboxes will be given to a vulnerable child, or family, through schools, nurseries, hospitals and orphanages. Your child should have brought a leaflet home which gives you more information. Please bring shoeboxes in by Friday 4th November.

As part of our school priorities, we will be monitoring attendance closely and will be using the Department of Education guidance to address poor attendance and punctuality. It is vitally important that your child attends school every day unless they are unwell. Research shows that poor attendance will impact negatively on a child's social and emotional wellbeing, as well as their academic progress. Teachers plan robust sequences of learning, and essential knowledge and skills can be missed if a child is away regularly.

Reading is another very important area which needs to be highlighted and please continue to support your child with reading regularly at home. Thank you so much to our parents who attended our recent phonics workshops, and we hope you found them very useful. Please encourage your child to read every day and record in their home/school reading diary.

The children are looking very smart in their school uniform. Thank you for your support as we make the transition from the old uniform to the new. The new school coats look extremely smart and are very warm, as well as being waterproof – just perfect for this time of year, as the weather turns colder.

Our Harvest Festival will take place in St Peter's Church on the morning of Thursday 20th October. We shall walk down to church first thing, and we would really appreciate it if parents are available to support us with the walk. We are suggesting that non-perishable items are donated for the harvest so that they can be passed on to the Food Bank.

It has been lovely welcoming parents on to the school site in the morning; it makes such a difference and gives you an opportunity to pass on any important messages to the teachers. 


Upper Arley C of E Primary School VISION AND VALUES



Happy Hares

The children in Happy Hares were excited to return and explore all the new resources in the classroom. Our topic this term is 'What is special about me'. We have made self-portraits, talked about who is in our family, shared our photos and looked at our likes and dislikes. The children met our new story time bear and came up with his name, "Ginger". He sits with the children during story time and likes to blow lots of bubbles at the end of the story.





Little Owls

This term in reception we have been focusing on numbers 1 to 10! We have been counting using our rules of counting and using ten frames to represent numbers up to 10! In Talk for Writing, we have been exploring lots of different texts. Giraffes can't dance, The Little Red Hen and The Elephant and the bad baby. We have become familiar with these stories and have created story maps with actions, role played the stories with masks and hot seated each other to take on the role of different characters.

In Topic we have been thinking about what makes us unique and how we are similar and different to our friends. We have created self-portraits, timelines of our milestones and goals on string to celebrate all the amazing milestones we have achieved!

The children have had a wonderful start to their learning in Owls this term. We enjoyed learning about each other and thinking about what makes us unique through our topic 'All About Me'. We are looking forward to finding out more about our local area too. We challenged ourselves in our learning. We can express and explain our ideas really well and are fabulous at acting out and inventing stories. We have been exploring our fantastic Forest School Area and using our enquiry skills to observe all the changes in the environment. We loved making a healthy snack using equipment to prepare and blend our fruit smoothies and we have had an exciting time taking part in a Multiskills competition. We all worked hard, tried our best and supported each other to show excellent sportsmanship. Well done, Owls!






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Falcons

Well, what a busy and exciting start to our new term this year. The first week back we welcomed a minibus to our school, kindly loaned to us for at least this year, by Hollymount School. This of course opens up a new avenue in terms of school trips, and Sports Events. Not only saving us money to use elsewhere in the P.E. Department, but also saving us a lot of admin and possible disappointment trying to hire buses from elsewhere.

It has also allowed us to make us of hourly, instead of half hourly swimming lessons at Holy Trinity, and even after only three weeks we can see what a difference it has made to their stroke development. Our events for this half term include Sports Crew, Multiskills, Tag rugby, and Volleyball.
